




- 1 To mount the throat mic gently spread the neckband, mount from behind the neck, and place the mics toward the front of the neck. Position microphone transducers as close to vocal cords as possible. Position microphones so the best transmission is achieved.
- 2 The neckband can be adjusted by pulling gently on the neckband to expand the size. The neckband will accommodate neck sizes 13" to 19".
- 3 The earpiece can be worn on either ear by simply turning the throat microphone over.
- 4 Place the earbud into the ear with the clear tube earpiece going behind the ear and up and over for a secure fit. Angle barb fitting can be rotated to eliminate any stress on-ear.

NEXUS SERIES:

Nexus Series PTT's use a US Nato Standard TP-120/U-174 connection. Firmly insert the male connector into the female receptacle. To remove, twist, and pull on male connector plastic cover-do not pull wires.



The Molle clip can be reversed to be used on left or right side of vest. Remove the screws using a phillips screwdriver and install the clip on the other side. You will need to insert the cap latch to the opposite side. Reinsert rubber screw covers.




Modular Series PTT's and Mod PTT Bypass use a 5-pin DIN connection. The connector cord and the push to talk module have male/female quick disconnect ports that need to be carefully lined up before being attached.

DO NOT force the quick release



If waterproof connection is difficult to separate, use a small flat blade screwdriver to peel back the seal and pop the male connector out.
